Context: Last day before crucifixion; Passover, betrayal, denial, trial.

- Mark 14:26-28** Jesus will be arrested and the disciples will scatter. Set's up restoration.
- Mark 14:29-31** Peter contradicts Jesus and is emphatic about not denying Jesus. All the disciples also.
1 Cor. 10:12
- Mark 14:32-34** The disciples sleep through Jesus' distress.
- Mark 14:35-38** Jesus surrenders his will to the Father. Peter doesn't have will power to not fall asleep.
2 Cor. 5:21
- Mark 14:39-47** Peter wakes up just in time to lop of the servants ear.
John 18:1-11 Jesus shows he is in full control of the events. The events are designed to lead to the cross.
- Mark 14:48-52** Jesus moves forward to drink the cup. The disciples panic, scatter and lose their cloths.
- Mark 14:53-61** Peter is trying to hang close. The trial is a sham. Jesus moves forward drinking the cup.
- Matt. 26:63-64** The religious leaders are hard hearted and reject the truth.
Psalms 139:23-24 Do you test yourself for hard heartedness?
- Mark 14:62-65** Jesus moves towards the cross.
- Mark 14:66-72** Peter's 3 denials.
Luke 22:60-62 Christ looks Peter in the eye and etches failure and shame in his soul.

There was a **relational interchange** of a person in need crying out for help sensing Jesus was a person who could give them hope of healing.

Luke 7 A shameful woman of the street. She believed Jesus would bless and not curse.

Judas betrayed and ran from Jesus and grace.

Peter betrayed and ran to Jesus and was restored and commissioned.
