Big Idea: Israel clamors for a king like the other nations. It's not in God's timing, but God consents to give them the king they want. God orchestrates a meeting between Samuel and Saul. By outward appearances, Saul is the right guy: handsome, tall, and the guy "on whom is all the desire of Israel."
