**Big Idea:** Genesis chapter 11 is the end of the first section of Genesis, which contains four big global events: Creation, The Fall, The Flood, and finally the Tower of Babel. The Tower of Babel account explains nations and languages, but perhaps more importantly, it exposes the human heart.
