Big Idea: During the great seven-year famine, Joseph's brothers are forced to Egypt to buy grain, resulting in a confrontation. They don't recognize Joseph, but they remember their misdeeds. They attribute their calamity to divine judgment – their "sin has found them out." But are they repentant?
