Passage: Read 2 Thessaloníans 2:1-3a

Younger Prompt: What does Paul encourage his readers in the first half of vs. 3?

Older Prompt: In what ways can we best equip ourselves to not be deceived?

Pray: Lord, help us to know the Truth and not be deceived. Guard us by your Holy Spirit so that we may walk in confidence that can only come from you.

$_{\mathsf{Day}}\,2$

Passage: Read 2 Thessalonians 2:36-7

Younger Prompt: What question does Paul ask in vs.

Older Prompt: What things do you think God wants us to remember when we encounter deceptive messages, doubts, or fears in life?

Pray: Lord, thank you for showing us your Truth in your Word. Help us to remember the things you've promised us, that we may not be deceived.

Day 3

Passage: Read 2 Thessaloníans 2:8-10

Younger Prompt: Who will kill the man of lawlessness, and how?

Older Prompt: Why is it important to remember that the man of lawlessness is no match for Jesus? How does this change how we encounter any trial in life?

Pray: Lord, thank you that you are the hero of the story. Thank you that you hold all power and authority and because you do, we have nothing to fear.

Day 4

Passage: Read 2 Thessalonians 2:11-12

Younger Prompt: What is the final outcome for those who pleasure in unrighteousness?

Older Prompt: What does it look like when someone pleasures in unrighteousness and dos not believe the truth?

Pray: Lord, teach us to love your Truth and pleasure in righteousness. Help us to abhor evil and avoid sin that ends in destruction.
