



At the heart of our vision is the desire to build bridges and build family. This resource is intended to be a tool that would help facilitate you, the spiritual leader of your family, to grow and develop your children in the fear and admonition of the Lord. While not exhaustive, our prayer is that it would give you a place to start in effort to better steward your role as mom or dad.

What follows is a four-day devotional that loosely follows our Sunday sermon series. It includes a passage to read, a prompt or two to discuss together, and a prayer to offer in response to your time. These efforts are simply offered as helpful direction. Feel the freedom to adjust, shift, or redirect the focus as best fits the few moments you take with your kids before bedtime, after dinner, or whenever you choose to lead them in God's Word.

Day 1

Passage: Read Genesis 1:1

Younger Prompt: Who was in the beginning? What did He do, in the beginning?

Older Prompt: What else did God make (see Genesis 1:3-27)?

Pray: Lord, thank you that you are from the beginning. Everything we praise you because you are eternal, without start and without end..

Day 2

Passage: Read Genesis 1:26-27

Younger Prompt: What did God make on the sixth day, and how did He make them?

Older Prompt: What difference does it make that God made man in His image? Why is it important to note that God made male and female in His image?

Pray: Lord, thank you for making us in your image. Thank you for making us unique, different than all other things you created. Help us to bear your image in the way you'd have us.

Day 3

Passage: Read Genesis 1:28

Younger Prompt: Who did God bless? What commands did He give them?

Older Prompt: What is dominion? Why did God give it to Adam and Eve?

Pray: Lord, thank you that you are the Creator and we are the creation, and thank you that you made us different from all other creation. Help us to glorify your name as we exercise the dominion you've given us everyday.

Day 4

Passage: Read Genesis 1:31

Younger Prompt: What did God say about all He had created, and why?

Older Prompt: Why did God think His creation was very good? Is it still today?

Pray: Lord, thank you for your creation. Thank you that you made things good and you alone know what good is. Help us as we seek your goodness in our lives, everyday.
