



At the heart of our vision is the desire to build bridges and build family. This resource is intended to be a tool that would help facilitate you, the spiritual leader of your family, to grow and develop your children in the fear and admonition of the Lord. While not exhaustive, our prayer is that it would give you a place to start in effort to better steward your role as mom or dad.

What follows is a four-day devotional that loosely follows our Sunday sermon series. It includes a passage to read, a prompt or two to discuss together, and a prayer to offer in response to your time. These efforts are simply offered as helpful direction. Feel the freedom to adjust, shift, or redirect the focus as best fits the few moments you take with your kids before bedtime, after dinner, or whenever you choose to lead them in God's Word.

Day 1

Passage: Read Genesis 15:1

Younger Prompt: What two things did God promise Abram? Are there things He's promised to you?

Older Prompt: How might knowing these promises given in vs. 1 affect Abram's decisions? How do God's promises given to you affect how you walk through each day?

Pray: Lord, thank you for your promises. Help us to cling to them everyday.

Day 2

Passage: Read Genesis 15:1-4

Younger Prompt: What is Abram concerned with in vs. 2?

Older Prompt: How does God respond to Abram's question in vs. 2?

Pray: Lord, thank you for revealing your faithfulness to Abram as you blessed him. Help us to remember you desire to bless us too, even in ways we may not understand.

Day 3

Passage: Read Genesis 15:5-6

Younger Prompt: What does God compare Abram's offspring to? Did Abram believe God this time?

Older Prompt: What did God mean when He said Abram's offspring would be like the stars in the sky? (See Galatians 3:26-29)

Pray: Lord, thank you that faith in you has always been the instrument You use to establish salvation. Make our faith in you strong as we follow you and your ways.

Day 4

Passage: Read Genesis 15:1-6

Younger Prompt: What is faith? What's the difference between having faith in something and merely believing in it?

Older Prompt: What did Abram's faith in God lead to? Is this still true today for us? (See Romans 4:22-25)

Pray: Lord, help us to lift our hand to you alone, everyday. When we struggle and perhaps fail, give us the strength to receive your grace and keep on growing.
