What follows is a four-day devotional that loosely follows our Sunday sermon series. It includes a passage to read, a prompt or two to discuss together, and a prayer to offer in response to your time. These efforts are simply offered as helpful direction. Feel the freedom to adjust, shift, or redirect the focus as best fits the few moments you take with your kids before bedtime, after dinner, or whenever you choose to lead them in God's Word.

Day 1

Passage: Read John 8:56-59

Younger Prompt: Who was Jesus saying he existed before?

Older Prompt: Why is Jesus' claim such a big deal that the Jews responded with stones, trying to kill him?

Pray: Lord, we recognize you are God. Thank you for being our King and our friend, the One who gave His life so we could be forgiven of our sins.

Day 2

Passage: Read John 6:35

Younger Prompt: What does bread do for a hungry person?

Older Prompt: What did Jesus mean when He claimed to be the bread of life?

Pray: Lord, thank you for being the bread of life. Thank you for being the only thing that truly satisfies. Help us to look to you alone for true satisfaction.

Passage: Read John 8:12

Younger Prompt: What is the purpose of light?

Older Prompt: How does Jesus operate like a light in our lives everyday?

Pray: Lord, thank you for being our light in a dark world. Help us to follow your light as you lead us to the locations you'd have us go.

Passage: Read John 10:7-12

Younger Prompt: Why do sheep need a good sheepherd?

Older Prompt: How does Jesus operate like a good shepherd in our lives everyday?

Pray: Lord, thank you for being our good shepherd. Thank you for protecting an guarding us against the evil things Satan and the world send our way. Help us to lean on you and trust you for guidance and protection, everyday.
