After years of living in a land that was not where Jacob was directed to go, he finally makes his way to Bethel. It is here, in Bethel, where God again appears to Jacob, gives him his new identity, a new son, and where Rachel and Isaac come to rest. It's the closure of one chapter, and the beginning of another.

What promise does God give Jacob immediately after his name change in vs. 11-12? Why is this particular order important to note? Consider the life, example, and situation Jacob just experienced in 34:30 for insight.

How significant is the identity change Jacob experiences in this section?

How does the experience of vs 2, 9-11 mirror that of Ephesians 4:21-32?

How certain are you of your spiritual identity? Is there a need for renewal of who you are in Christ?
